4. What would you consider an acceptable percentage of time to spend on a study of prophecy compared to other areas of the Bible that you should be studying daily?
5. Why do you think God presented information about the End Times in such mysterious ways?
6. How does the knowledge that one day you will present yourself before God for His judgment affect your daily life as His child?
7. Why has the Jewish nation been the object of much tribulation and persecution over all of history? What is the significance that it continues to bounce back and still exists today?
8. Why do you think Christianity is being forced by the world and other religions to stop stressing doctrinal issues such as abortion, gay marriage, and homosexuality and to focus instead on “social issues” such as equality of material wealth?
9. Briefly discuss your understanding of the Rapture, the Great Tribulation, the Antichrist, the millennial rule of Christ, and the battle of Armageddon.
