- 1. Why did the disciples of Jesus ask Him to teach them to pray? What is the significance of addressing God as Father? What does hallowed mean? What does the request for bread entail? Is forgiving others before God will forgive us some sort of works that we must do to be forgiven by God? What is involved in asking God to not lead us into temptation?
- 2. In verses 5-10, do you think Jesus is teaching that the squeaky wheel gets the grease? What is the significance that the request is for a friend? What is the message of these verses for us today?
- **3.** In verses 11-13, Jesus gives us a message of trust in what we ask of the Father. What is that message?
- **4.** In verses 14-20, Jesus is accused of being in league with the devil. What was the logic Jesus used to refute that accusation? What did Jesus mean when He said that He cast out demons by the finger of God?
- 5. In verses 21-23, how can people who think they are gathering actually be scattering?
- 6. Verses 21-23 are a severe warning for all of us when thinking about cleaning up an environment so that people will act better toward each other. Apply this to some of the political statements being made today about improving our society.
- 7. What is the message of Jesus for us today in verses 27-28?
- **8.** In verses 29-32, what is the meaning of Jesus concerning the sign of Jonah? Who is the Queen of the South?
- **9.** In verses 33-34 Jesus gives us some marching orders. What is the spiritual meaning of the light? What is the meaning of a bad eye?
- **10.** In verses 35-36, Jesus speaks more about light. How can your light actually be darkness? What are some ways that preachers and teachers today are deceiving people listening to them?
- **11.** In verses 37-41, comment on the practice of washing before eating. Why did Jesus call the Pharisees fools?
- **12.** In verses 42-43 Jesus begins a series of woes on the Pharisees. Apply this woe to people in churches today.
- **13.** In verses 44-48, how can Jesus say these people ar like concealed tombs? How specifically do these lawyers weigh people down with burdens too hard to bear and how does this apply to us today?
- **14.** In verses 49-51, what is the significance of speaking of the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah?
- **15.** In verses 52-54, how do these lawyers take away the key to knowledge? Apply this to some teachers today.
