To each of you, my personal gratitude . . .

How blessed we have been to study the Gospel of Matthew this year and focus our attention on the Kingdom of Heaven as we have faced many challenges and uncertainties brought by the pandemic and the election which will bring significant changes in government leadership. And there are other matters which demand our attention including personal health and financial concerns, family needs, disruption in our work and worship activities, restrictions on our interaction with those whom we love, and even shortages and rationing of supplies we have enjoyed in abundance in the past. So, we must be sure we have the right perspective and priorities, not focusing on temporary things but making sure we have eternal things rightly in order.

We have had twenty-three lessons from Matthew, beginning on January 14 with a five-month interruption, and ending our study today, November 17, 2020.
